### **Before and After School Routines**

### Morning

# Google Classroom




Google Classroom is an online collaboration tool, allowing students and teachers to work together on tasks, or simply to share information. It is a safe environment, monitored by teachers. Students can only join a classroom if the teacher explicitly shares a specific code. Students are likely to be members of several Google Classrooms created by teachers for class tasks and for homework assignments.

DET supported and can be accessed directly through the student portal.

## Homework

All homework will be available on our Stage 2 Google Classroom. They log into the student portal at home using their Department of Education username and password Students can ask teachers at school if they need assistance with their username or password Homework will be fortnightly 'Must do' activities are reading, Maths and spelling 'Can do' activities differ each fortnight but may include Science, Art, History etc.



Students will click 'turn in' when they have finished their homework.

Reading with your child at home document

If a student starts reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of Year 6 they would have read for the equivalent of 60 school days. If they read for 5 minutes per day, they would have read for 12 school days. If they read for 1 minute a day, the student would have read for 3 school days.
